FRIDAY – FEBRUARY 25, 2011

Depart Washington (Dulles) for Johannesburg on South African Airways.

SATURDAY – FEBRUARY 26, 2011

On arrival at Johannesburg's Oliver Tambo International Airport's Central Terminal Building/Terminal B, collect your luggage and then clear customs and immigration. Connect with your domestic flight to Cape Town.

There is a baggage recheck area located right after the customs area, but before you exit the International Arrivals area. You can surrender your checked baggage at the baggage re-check counter and then proceed to your connecting domestic flight.

On arrival at Cape Town Airport you will be met by a **South African Airways Vacations** representative and transferred to your hotel.

The gracious **Table Bay Hotel** is situated in Cape Town's Victoria & Alfred Waterfront with its array of wonderful shops, restaurants and bars. Guests are offered panoramic views across the Atlantic Ocean to Robben Island while behind soars Table Mountain. Combined with contemporary charm and attention to detail, the hotel recalls the era of the great cruise liners and elegant hotels that served them. The Table Bay Hotel is a 5-star, 329-room hotel and it uniquely responds to its magnificent surroundings. It has a maritime flavor that extends to each room and suite, which has sea or mountain views and is a luxurious port of call. The interior of the hotel presents a kaleidoscope of impressions, from the European marble mosaic of the entrance court to the intricate parquet floor of the foyer framed by the full-scale drama of Table Mountain, with the activity of the harbor in the foreground. Below the foyer to the south, is the grand lounge with its cathedral ceiling and twin fireplaces.

SUNDAY – FEBRUARY 27, 2011

After breakfast depart on your full day **Cape Peninsula and Table Mountain Tour** with lunch included. The tour starts early with a visit to Table Mountain (weather permitting) which is well known, for its spectacular views. After making your descent you will start the rest of your tour. See for yourself how this spectacular southern tip of Africa became known as the 'Fairest Cape'. Drive past the pristine beaches of Camps Bay, Clifton and Llandudno - currently the hottest real estate in the world - to Hout Bay, a functioning harbor and heart of the local crayfish industry (optional Seal Island cruise, time permitting). After a stop for lunch, it's on to the Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve and its scenic viewing point. The spectacular sea and mountain views are reason enough to make the 41 mile trip from Cape Town. Amid the rocky landscape - home to mountain zebra, eland and ostriches - blooms magnificent Cape flora.

Continue along the coastline to the beautiful Boulders Beach where you can sit among a colony of penguins wandering free amongst the bathers. Walk along the pathway to the beach for a close view of this fascinating species. You will have the opportunity to watch them at close range, a delightful sight. You may even want to join the locals for a swim alongside these little creatures or bask in the sun on one of the rocks.

Don't be surprised to find a penguin watching you. They are very familiar with people, yet quite shy. Return to your hotel in the late afternoon.

MONDAY – FEBRUARY 28, 2011

This morning you will be taken on a half day **Winelands tour**. While South Africa's fertile valleys are world famous for their crisp white and classic French-style red wines, the Winelands area is also a treasury of rustic beauty and sprawling estates shaded by giant oak trees. The backdrop of the Hottentots Holland Mountains, the white gabled Cape Dutch homesteads and the oak-lined streets and lanes all blend in to give this place a charm that will not be quickly forgotten. See some of the wine estates that were developed by early settlers who produced the wines sought after by Napoleon, Bismarck and royalty such as Edward VII. Stop for a wine-tasting on an estate, where you will have the opportunity to purchase some of the wines.

You will then be transferred for a fabulous lunch at **Moyo Restaurant at Spier** courtesy of Mervis Diamond Importers. Moyo is an unforgettable outdoor dining experience that captures the essence of the unique Cape African culture. A fusion of modern sophisticated décor and distinctly African flavored dishes create an inspiring culinary affair. Relax and enjoy the spectacular vistas while you are treated to the colorful brand of Cape African hospitality.

There is an extensive buffet served, which is as rich and exciting as the many diverse cultures. The tree-lined garden is filled with Bedouin tents and gazebos made from wrought iron and the tree-houses are clad with beautiful hand crafted copper water features.

The afternoon will be at leisure.

TUESDAY – MARCH 1, 2011

Today is a day of leisure to enjoy the wonderful city of Cape Town. Otherwise you may wish to join an optional half day Robben Island tour for an additional USD45 per person.

Make your way to the jetty at the Clocktower at the Victoria & Alfred Waterfront to catch the ferry for the half hour boat ride to Robben Island for your **Robben Island tour**. This was where former South African president, Nelson Mandela and other political prisoners were held. It is now a World Heritage Site with stunning views of Cape Town and Table Mountain.

For nearly 400 years **Robben Island**, 7½miles/12kms off the coast from Cape Town was a place of banishment, exile, isolation and imprisonment. It was here that rulers sent those they regarded as political troublemakers, social outcasts and the unwanted of society.

During the apartheid years Robben Island became internationally known for its institutional brutality. Robben Island came to symbolize, not only for South Africa and the African continent, but also for the entire world, the triumph of the human spirit over enormous hardship and adversity. Today, you will be escorted around the island by an ex-political prisoner, and given insight into the past and how the human spirit triumphs.

The remainder of the day will be at leisure. **Cape Town** is a city with a diverse range of attractions, sights and activities to offer and has something for everyone. From the landmark beaches of Clifton and Camps Bay to the vibrant V&A Waterfront and Cape Town city centre, the award-winning wine farms of Stellenbosch and Franschhoek - time spent in Cape Town will not be forgotten. Cape Town is a sophisticated city at the gateway to a majestic continent. The Mother City is a place where old and new harmoniously converge - in history, architecture, cultural pursuits and the essence of its people.

The city is dominated by a towering, table-shaped mountain, set on a peninsula of soaring, rocky heights and lush valleys, where two oceans converge- Indian and Atlantic. Natural beauty and the fast pace and bright lights of a great urban centre meld effortlessly here. Firmly positioned on the international map, Cape Town offers a myriad things to do and places to see, whatever your tastes, inclinations or budget.

WEDNESDAY – MARCH 2, 2011

Today you will be transferred from your hotel to Cape Town Airport in time for your scheduled flight to Johannesburg.

On arrival at Johannesburg Airport you will be met and transferred by road to Entabeni Private Game Reserve.

Entabeni Private Game Reserve, "The Place of the Mountain", is situated in the World Heritage "Waterberg Biosphere" of the Waterberg region. Less than a three-hour drive north of Johannesburg This **malaria-free** reserve boasts five eco-systems. The upper escarpment offers majestic craggy rock formations and wide open grass plains.

The Legend Golf and Safari Resort consists of an exceptional golf course with a luxury estate as well as facilities where wildlife and spectacular landscapes are all part of an intended lifestyle. The resort reflects the rich cultural legacy of this ancient part of Africa. This is an exceptional residential estate, where the Big Five roam free on this 22,000 hectare safari conservancy. OPTIONAL GOLF

After breakfast enjoy a day of golf at **The Legend Golf & Safari Resort**

The golf course is designed as an 18 hole championship golf course, providing all golfers, irrespective of their handicap, the experience of a true African challenge. The course plays at 4 miles for daily play but is capable of being extended to 5 miles for tournaments, making it one of the longest in the world.

Set on the legendary 54 000 acre Entabeni Safari Conservancy, the course has flowing fairways which wind through the open grasslands and dense bush. The design and layout of the course are in complete harmony with the natural resources. The pristine bushveld environment has been preserved and the course remains one of the most environmentally sensitive in Africa.

The sheer scale of the golf course, with gently undulating greens and strategic bunkering ensures a unique golfing experience with breathtaking views of the Waterberg Mountains as a backdrop. On any given hole, a range of 5 tees allows the golf course to be set up for both professional and amateur players and creates the flexibility that one needs for an enjoyable golfing experience.

Golf includes cart, halfway house lunch and caddy/ranger

OPTIONAL EXTREME 19TH HOLE

The uniqueness of Legend Golf and Safari Resort is reflected in the spectacular **Extreme 19th hole** which is the longest and most dramatic Par 3 in the world.

Set high up on the impressive Hanglip Mountain and accessible only by helicopter, this par 3 hole is played from a vertical height of 1410 feet. After a short, breathtaking helicopter flight, golfers have the opportunity of teeing off from one of three tee boxes, high up on the escarpment. With advanced technology in the form of four separate cameras and the latest tracking equipment, the golfer can follow and capture the tee shot and the flight of the ball.

The fairway is seeded with Cynodon grass and contoured to funnel the ball to the green below. In celebration of the African Renaissance, the green has been shaped like the map of Africa and is protected by a large waste bunker.

Extreme 19th hole includes helicopter flights, 6 balls, use of clubs, and assistance from the Resident Pro, cap, glove and certificate of completion.

These pages are in addition to the endorsement/amendment pages at the back of the passport. South African government regulations prohibit airlines from boarding passengers without the required blank visa pages.

SATURDAY – MARCH 5, 2011

Today you will be transferred to OR Tambo International Airport. On arrival at Johannesburg Airport you will then be met and transferred to the Michelangelo Hotel where you will spend the night.

Overlooking Nelson Mandela Square and forming an integral part of Renaissance-styled Sandton Square, is the 5-star **Michelangelo Hotel** - a member of '*The Leading Hotels of the World*'. The hotel has a majestic dome in glass and steel which tops the entrance lobby atrium that rises eight stories. Scenic elevators overlook the atrium with its arches, columns, and decorative balustrades. All the rooms are tastefully decorated to reflect the elegant Renaissance-style that has been carried throughout the hotel. Each room contains high-speed Internet access, a minibar, safe, and coffee and tea makers. The hotel has an indoor pool, fitness center, sauna and steam room. We visit Constitution Hill, the home of the country's Constitutional Court and site of Johannesburg's Old Fort Prison, where thousands of ordinary people and many of South Africa's leading political activists, were once detained and brutally punished. Visit the Nelson Mandela Bridge in Newtown.

Afterwards we proceed to downtown Johannesburg, the historical heart of Johannesburg, where amid the inner city decay is heartening evidence of the many urban regeneration schemes underway. Learn about the workings of the Supreme Court and the symbolism of Gandhi Square before visiting the vibrant Market Theatre and Museum Afrika.
